Flu Season is here!!!!

As another school year—and another flu season—begins, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is offering simple tips on hand washing. Hand washing is one the easiest and most effective ways to keep from getting sick and spreading germs. The CDC recommends that students and staff wash their hands often with soap and water, especially after sneezing or coughing.

Visit <u>http://www.cdc.gov/cleanhands/</u> for information about how and when to wash hands. Did you know that you should rub your hands together with soap for 20 seconds (as long as it takes to sing "Happy Birthday" twice) before rinsing?

If soap and water are not available, the CDC recommends using alcohol-based hand sanitizers. A reminder that state rules require licensed child care providers to keep over-the-counter medications (which includes hand sanitizers) stored inaccessible to children. Hand sanitizers must be used according to the manufacturer's label and under appropriate adult supervision. As with any over-the-counter medication, child care providers must have written permission from parents or guardians to use it.

3D PUMPKINS (OR APPLES)

What you'll need

- colored tissue paper
- glue
- Pencils
- Printout of pumpkin

Directions



Great for just about any age! Cut up tissue paper into small squares (about 2in. by 2in). Give each child a copy of a pumpkin on white paper and some pieces of the tissue paper. Take the eraser end of a pencil, twist the tissue paper around the end and dip it in glue. Then place it on the pumpkin so that the paper is standing up. Once the whole pumpkin is covered you have a 3D pumpkin. Make a pumpkin patch board and these look great! You can also do these with apples, and make an apple tree!

Hib Vaccine Required for Children

In February of 2008, the State Board of Health temporarily suspended the requirement of the Haemophilus influenza type b (Hib) booster vaccine due to a national shortage of the vaccine. As of July 1, 2009, the Hib supply has improved enough to reinstate a booster dose. According to the State Board of Health's reinstatement procedures, any eligible child between the ages of 12 and 15 months will again be required to have a booster dose of Hib vaccine by September 28, 2009, in order to attend child care facilities and preschools. Any eligible child of this age without a booster dose of Hib vaccine after September 28, 2009, will be out of compliance with state law.

A letter from Dr. Maxine Hayes, Washington State Health Officer--and a detailed implementation plan to help child care facilities and preschools comply with reinstatement of the Hib vaccine booster dose requirement-are being mailed to child care centers and preschools around the state and can be found on the Immunization Program CHILD Profile's Web site at <u>www.doh.wa.gov/</u> cfh/Immunize/schools/vaccine.htm.

WHAT PRODUCTS MUST BE STORED INACCESSIBLE

TO CHILDREN?

Recently, family home child care licensors have been asked why a particular dish soap needed to be stored inaccessible to children since it was not labeled as a toxic product. This is an excellent question!

The family home child care regulations require certain products to be stored "inaccessible to children", which means they must be stored in such a way that it is impossible for children to reach or use them. According to WAC 170-296-0820(1) the following items must be stored inaccessible to children:

- Cleaning supplies
- Toxic or poisonous substances
- Aerosols
- Items with warning labels
- Cosmetics
- Personal hygiene products

Because dish soap falls into the category of cleaning supplies, it is one of those items that must be stored inaccessible to children, regardless of whether or not it is labeled "toxic" or "keep out of reach of children".

*Here are some examples of additional items that would need to be stored inaccessible to children:

- Sanitizing products such as bleach solutions
- Cleaning products for floors, ovens, tubs, tiles and toilets
- Anything in an aerosol (spray) can
- Anything with a warning label such as "Caution", "Poison", or "Keep Out of Reach of Children"
- Make-up, hair gel, perfumes
- Deodorant, toxic shampoo, mouthwash
